Dear Key Stage 2 Parents,

On Monday 23<sup>rd</sup> March in the afternoon, we will be holding our Spring Olympics for Years 3 – 6. This is an afternoon of sport where your child will get the opportunity to compete in one of 8 team sports for their school team. Each sport has a trophy which will be awarded to the most successful team in that sport.

Every member of the juniors (Years 3 – 6) will take part so please can you ensure that your child has a complete PE kit in school for Monday (children should wear their school uniform to school). This should include a t-shirt, shorts and trainers.

If your child has a t-shirt, the colour of their team, they should wear this rather than their school t-shirt. If they do not own a t-shirt in the correct colour, it is fine to wear their normal school PE shirt as we have some coloured bibs available.

Children will be told on **Friday** which sport they will be playing and will also be reminded which team they are part of. All children will be asked to write this information in their reading records to ensure that it is easy for you to find.

No specialist equipment is required for any of the sports, however to give the children the opportunity to experience sports at a competitive level and be safe, we ask that:

- Those that are playing football will need to wear shin pads with long socks and may wear studded boots if they choose as it will be played on the field (if your child requires either please let us know before the day and we can source some).
- Children that are playing hockey, may bring in their hockey stick from home on the day, there is no requirement for shin pads but we would recommend that if they have them then they should wear them. There is no requirement for a mouth guard for hockey but if a child owns one they are welcome to wear it.

As our Spring Olympics consist of team sports, they take up the majority of the space in our grounds and, therefore, we are sorry but we are unable to accommodate any parents at this event. However, we will invite parents to our annual sports day in May.
